These concerts are always enormous fun, especially when we all sing the Twelve Days of Christmas together!

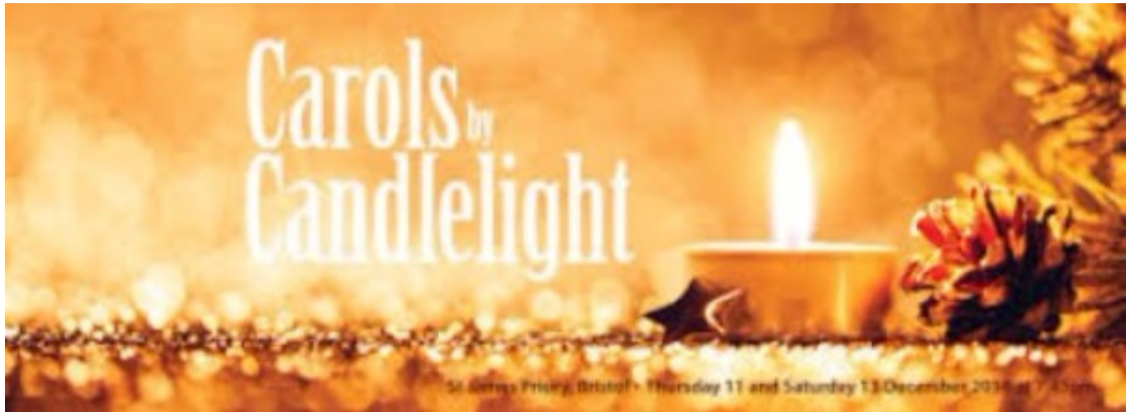
So come along and enjoy. Tickets are €10 and that includes a mince pie and glass of wine afterwards as well.

## Children's Christingle Service

# Christingle



**Saturday, 23rd December at 5pm at Ss.Philip & James, Palma**

A traditional but relaxed service of prayer and drama, singing and reading. Everyone receives a Christingle during the service which represents the life of Christ given for the world. It consists of an orange, a red ribbon, four sweets and a lighted candle.

The Christingle tradition originates in Moravia in central Europe and is used by Anglican Churches to raise money for the Children's Society to buy gifts for children who have nothin at Christmas time.
