OPENING PRAYER

Almighty Father, whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the King of all: govern the hearts and minds of those in authority, and bring the families of the nations, divided and torn apart by the ravages of sin, to be subject to his just and gentle rule; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

A Reading from the book of Job
(1:1-5,19:23-27)

In the land of Uz there lived a man whose name was Job. This man was blameless and upright; he feared God and shunned evil. ²He had seven sons and three daughters, ³and he owned seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen and five hundred donkeys, and had a large number of servants. He was the greatest man among all the people of the East.

⁴His sons used to hold feasts in their homes on their birthdays, and they would invite their three sisters to eat and drink with them.⁵When a period of feasting had run its course, Job would make arrangements for them to be purified. Early in the morning he would sacrifice a burnt offering for each of them, thinking, "Perhaps my children have sinned and cursed God in their hearts." This was Job's regular custom.

²³"Oh, that my words were recorded, that they were written on a scroll,

²⁴that they were inscribed with an iron tool on^[a] lead,

or engraved in rock forever!

²⁵I know that my redeemer^[b] lives, and that in the end he will stand on the

earth.^[c]

²⁶And after my skin has been destroyed, yet^[d] in^[e] my flesh I will see God;

²⁷I myself will see him

with my own eyes—I, and not another.

How my heart yearns within me!

This is the word of the Lord.
