The Word of God

Psalm 142 I cry aloud to the Lord; ♦ to the Lord I make my supplication. I pour out my complaint before him ♦ and tell him of my trouble. When my spirit faints within me, you know my path; ♦ in the way wherein I walk have they laid a snare for me. I look to my right hand, and find no one who knows me; ♦ I have no place to flee to, and no one cares for my soul. I cry out to you, O Lord, and say: ♦ 'You are my refuge, my portion in the land of the living. 'Listen to my cry, for I am brought very low; ♦ save me from my persecutors, for they are too strong for me. 'Bring my soul out of prison, that I may give thanks to your name; ♦ when you have dealt bountifully with me, then shall the righteous gather around me.'

Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning is now and shall be for ever. Amen.

Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. Look in mercy upon all who suffer, and hear those who cry out in pain and desolation: Lord, have mercy. 13 Bring comfort to the dying, and gladden their hearts with the vision of your glory: Lord, have mercy.

Give rest to the departed and bring them, with your saints, to glory everlasting: Lord, have mercy. Let us commend the world, for which Christ died, to the mercy and protection of God.

Open prayer may be offered and silence kept.

Soul of Christ, sanctify me, body of Christ, save me, blood of Christ, inebriate me, water from the side of Christ, wash me.

Passion of Christ, strengthen me. O good Jesus, hear me: hide me within your wounds and never let me be separated from you.. >From the wicked enemy defend me, in the hour of my death, call me and bid me come to you, so that with your saints I may praise you for ever and ever. Amen.

Let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven.
